West End residents' parking : The proposals with regard to residents' parking are, at time of my writing this month's update, due to go to the City Council's City Development Committee the night before the Community Council meeting.

As the issue will be discussed at this month's West End Community Council meeting, I thought it helpful to reproduce the amendment I intend to move at the council committee relative to community consultation :

Item 4 - Proposed extension of residents' parking schemes

Add an additional recommendation :

2.2 Before preparing the three Traffic Regulation Orders, officers are instructed to undertake a consultation exercise on the proposals in this report with the communities in the affected areas, including with Community Councils and residents' and tenants' groups and report back their findings to City Development Committee.

West End recycling changes : In you live in the areas of either Phase 1 or Phase 2 of the recycling rollout (introduction of current recycling services back in 2015) what you put in your waste and recycling bins is changing - including how often they are collected.



This affects most of the West End Ward apart from the Perth Road Lanes area which was in Phase 4 (last year - 2017).

The council is making these changes because the Scottish Government's Household Recycling Charter has been introduced and it changes what will go into the blue bin and the burgundy bin.

Residents affected will have by now received a mailing from the council explaining the changes which are effective from 16th April 2018. You can read more on the council's website.

You should continue to use your bins as normal until then and the council is running information sessions as follows - all welcome!

Blackness Library	19 th March	4.30pm to 6.30pm
Tesco Riverside	29 th March	12 noon to 3pm

Dog fouling complaints tackled : I have recently received further complaints from residents in the Peddie Street area about dog fouling on local pavements.

I raised this with the Animal Control Officer who advises :

“I agree it is a continuing problem in this area. At the moment I am still monitoring this situation as often as I can. Litter bins can also be used to dispose of dog fouling.

If you can inform residents to contact our office if they witness any dog walker not picking up after their dog. Time, date and description would be helpful.”
